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### **OPENING BY THE CHAIRPERSON**

The Chairperson, Cr M Banasik opened the Community Forum at 6.33pm. The Chairperson welcomed all those in attendance at the Community Forum. The Chairperson introduced the Mayor, Cr Landow Councillors, the General Manager, Directors and other staff to the Community Forum participants.

The Chairperson stated that the electronic recording of the Community Forum and the use of electronic media during the proceedings is not permitted including such devices as laptops, mobile phones, tape recorders and video cameras. The Chairperson requested that participants switch off their mobile phones.

The Chairperson handed over to the Mayor who spoke briefly about media reports regarding a jail in Wollondilly. He advised that we have no information at present however Council had spoken to the Department of Planning and were setting up a meeting with the Minister. He assured the participants that Community Consultation would be undertaken on the matter as more information comes to hand.

### 1. <u>Community Safety</u>

Police officers from two of the three Local Area Commands (LAC's) covering Wollondilly presented information to the community on current community safety issues within the Shire as follows:

Inspector Tara Norton, Customer Service duty officer, Campbelltown LAC provided a breakdown of statistics for the previous three months for Appin. Highlights of the statistics noted are listed below:

- 2 Assaults
- 4 Break and Enters
- 6 Business Inspection (In the last 2 months)
- 1 Breach of an Apprehended Violence Order (AVO)
- 1 Fire
- Several frauds (fuel drive offs)
- 2 locations of stolen property
- 4 drug offences
- 2 stolen vehicles located
- 7 traffic accidents
- 3 people scheduled under mental health legislation
- 1 minor traffic incident
- 3 'move on' directions
- 8 person and 8 vehicle searches
- 1 sexual assault

In relation to Appin Road which was described as going as far as the intersection near the top of Bulli Pass, the accident statistics given were as follows:

Year	Injuries	Non Injuries
2015	9 (1 Fatality)	8
2016	7 (2 Fatalities)	3

The number of fatalities in total dating back to 2011 was reported as 8.

A number of questions were asked and answered on the night.

The Chairperson thanked Inspector Norton and introduced the next speaker.

Duty officer, Phil Gornall of Camden LAC made an apology for Inspector Mick Pearsall who was unable to attend tonight. Inspector Gornall advised that he was the Crime Co-ordinator at Camden and in this role he was in charge of the crime prevention officers, licencing and community events to name a few and he appreciated the opportunity to introduce himself to the community.

The following information was provided:

- Break and Enters (Non dwelling) 2014 were 86 and 2015 were 36, significant drop
- Domestic Violence There has been an increase in reports however this is not necessarily seen as a bad thing but rather a sign of greater levels of reporting occurring
- AVO's being changed to be more stream lined
- St George LAC is part of a pilot program, the Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme which allows individuals at risk to be informed of their partners background
- The other area of concern was Fraud which was broken down into fail to pays, internet fraud and tap and go fraud (card misuse).

Inspector Gornall encouraged that minimal amounts of money be kept in your predominant accounts, especially if you have tap and go because a large number of purchases can be made in a short space of time before a stolen card can be deactivated.

A number of guestions were asked which were answered on the night.

The Chairperson thanked both officers for their attendance.


