ELECTION SIGNS IN PUBLIC PLACES PROTOCOL

PURPOSE OF THIS PROTOCOL

• To advise registered political parties, groups, candidates and others they may display posters and the like relating to their election campaign from the start of the official opening of the election until 7 days after polling day at which time they must be removed.

Wollondilly Shire Council

• The Returning Officer of the New South Wales Electoral Commission (NSWEC) has the authority to remove or cause to be removed any poster exhibited or posted in contravention of the Electoral Act 2017 during the election period.

1. PRINCIPLES

1.1 **Definition of Election Signs**

Election signs are any freestanding advertising device identifying candidates and/or promoting a political party at local government elections.

1.2 **Definition of Election Period**

For the purpose of this protocol the election period refers to the issuing of the Writs by the Governor General until the declaration of the poll.

1.3 Enquiries and Complaints in relation to Electoral signage during the Election Period

During the election period all enquiries including public safety issues in relation to election signage will be directed to the Returning Officer.

1.4 Enquiries and Complaints in relation to Electoral signage after the Election Period

Council will respond to any public safety or compliance issues in relation to election signage after the election period. Council officers will remove or arrange for the removal of the offending sign and Council will recover the cost of removal in accordance with Council's adopted fees and charges from the candidate responsible.
