5.	 Committee Induction Introductions from each member 	Attendees introduced themselves with a brief outline of their background and why they applied to be a member of the Committee.	
	 Overview of the Terms of Reference & Scope 	Cr Banasik outlined the Terms of Reference and reiterated the importance of keeping these meetings at a high/strategic level, and that unrelated concerns or operational issues (e.g. pot holes, missed bins etc.) be raised via Council's communication channels.	
		The Strategic Reference Group Terms of Reference and Operating Guidelines were sent to all members via email with the agenda and was available in hard copy during the meeting.	
	• Overview of the Code of Conduct	No objections were raised by the Committee. Members were asked speak to a Councillor or Council staff if in doubt or if there is a problem.	
	 Meeting Scheduling and timing 	Cr Banasik suggested that the next meeting will be held on a Monday and if there are any issues it will be discussed at the next meeting. There were no objections to holding future meetings on Monday. An invite for the next two meetings will be sent to the group soon.	
	Remote Attendance	Hybrid meetings will continue with remote attendance via Microsoft Teams an option. The in- person meeting location will always be held in the Shire Hall Boardroom.	
		Mandy advised that Harry Burkett from Colong Foundation is a standing guest and will attend meetings where Warragamba Dam is discussed. If anyone has expertise in a certain agenda subject we can invite them along.	

William D'Arcy expressed his concerns that the Wilton development, (including number and of grey roofs), is an issue and is relevant to this SRG however, it is not listed in the scope. Mayor Gould advised that this matter sits across a couple of SRGs	
and there will be overlaps.	

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	Geraldine Cox asked whether SRG's can merge. Mayor Gould advised that SRG's will not be joined however, the minutes for each SRG meeting will be made available on the Council website. Mayor Gould confirmed that sub-committees between different groups can be formed. Mayor Gould advised that Council wants to understand the thoughts of the Committee on matters relevant to the Committee. The community has a lot of knowledge and Council would like to get as many insights as possible. Council is changing the way we hold meetings and SRG members should be given opportunity to drive this meeting as much as Council.	
	Rowland Ware expressed his concerns about how such a big list of key focus areas can be covered in 3 meetings per year and suggested creating sub- committees in between the scheduled SRG meetings.	
	Mayor Gould expressed concerns surrounding resourcing to run sub-committees and advised that teething difficulties are to be expected as the creation of SRG's is new. The group was requested to give feedback so future meetings can be run more effectively.	
	Mayor Gould explained that each Councillor was given portfolios to focus on and the 5 SRG's were created to align to each key strategic pillar of Council and will be used to provide advice at a strategic level. The intention of creating the SRG's is to have the community involved and aware of what council is doing. This may overlap into different SRG's areas.	
	William D'Arcy questioned whether the group can receive feedback about if their suggestions achieved anything. Mayor Gould advised that attendees can make recommendations to Council and will work out strategies to ensure ideas go somewhere.	
	Glenn Sant mentioned that he would like to hear from staff about what residents are raising with them. Glenn suggested that the highest risk issues should form the framework for sub-committees. As a resident, Glenn loses track of strategic projects in the Environment space, especially regarding Wilton town development. Community Strategic Plan Delivery Plan (2022-23):

- The CSP is a 10-year plan put together by the Waste and Environment team which contains the biggest issues facing the environment.
- Hard copies of the CSP were made available to the group.
- Wollondilly has a huge geographical area with a diverse and significant natural environment. Many of the projects Waste & Environment team complete are grant funded requiring the team are trying to balance the resources they have and apply for grants at the same time which can be very time consuming.
- Mandy urged the group to have a look at the CSP and think about what's important to them and what the group would like to see happening. Actions with a black dot next are funded while actions without a black dot are either partially or not funded.
- Mandy Marino also requested for the group to provide feedback on the Delivery Plan in terms of what's important to them and what the group would like to see happening. Council staff will then be able to put resources into it and apply for funding if any grants appear.
- Waste:
 - A future of waste services survey was carried out in July 2021 and lots of residents provided feedback. The feedback was taken on board and it resulted in festive season weekly recycling being introduced. The feedback received from the survey will also assist the waste team to form the next waste collection contract.
 - Feedback from the survey indicated that many residents would like Wollondilly Council to provide a weekly waste collection service similar to Camden Council. Mandy explained that Camden is a much smaller local government area and the bin presentation rates are quite low with around 35%-40% of people presenting both recycling and garden organics bins for emptying every week.
 - Tender evaluations are underway for the regional waste disposal tender which is set to commence in July 2024 and is a joint project with Wingecarribee, Camden & Campbelltown Council.
 - One option in the tender was FOGO (food organics and garden organics) which involves food scraps being place into the green-lid organics bin and being emptied weekly. NSW

	 neighbouring Council's need to make during the tender evaluation process is that the NSW EPA haven't provided information about the output quality of the FOGO collected, especially when biodegradable plastic products are involved. A group decision with our regional partner Council's will be made. Wollondilly currently have a fantastic quality of garden organics with less than 1% contamination rate. Once FOGO is implemented, Wollondilly's contamination rate will drastically increase until residents adjust to the change. The cost of FOGO is offset by less landfilling but there is a cost to introduce the service. The introduction of FOGO for rural households is another issue the waste team are currently working through. The Mixed Waste Organic Material (MWOO) saga and the advised of the similar risk surrounding FOGO. To compensate for the fire loss, Geraldine suggested that Council speak with Endeavour Energy to request for them to install nest boxes when trimming trees, adding that the Men's Shed could possibly create the nest boxes. Ibrahim Muharrem advised that the Tahmoor Men's Shed were approached to provide some examples of nest boxes that will be kept at the Robyn Davies Community Nursery.
