

Wollondilly Shire Council is part way through a massive roadworks blitz, thanks to \$9.5M road repair funding from the State Government's Regional and Local Roads Repair Program to help address the flood damage across the Shire's 870km road network.

While Wollondilly was excluded from the first round of pothole repair funding, Mayor Matt Gould alongside other Mayors from the fringes of Greater Sydney have successfully advocated for additional support to help with the backlog of storm damage.

In response to a series of extreme weather events and the wettest year on record for our Shire in 2022, Wollondilly Council has been working hard to get on top of approximately \$140m of significant damage to our roads.

The funds will be directed to targeted reconstruction/heavy patching and repair works all over the Shire, from Bargo to Warragamba, Buxton to Menangle, Appin to Oakdale, Tahmoor to Douglas Park. Every corner of the Shire will see substantial works on the ground in the next phase of our massive road repair program.

Mayor Gould has worked closely with other councils as well as Member for Wollondilly Nathaniel Smith MP to make sure the NSW Government is aware of the critical road issues that we are facing in the Shire.

The Mayor met with several key ministers late last year to push for additional support for Wollondilly. It is great to see that Council's strong advocacy on this issue was listened to and we are now getting some much-needed help.

Wollondilly Shire Council has received a \$50,000 grant from the Regional Office of Youth, Children and Young People Wellbeing Recovery Initiative in response to the floods and storms which significantly impacted the Shire in 2022.

The grant will fund the Youth Stories project, which will be delivered to the young people of the Shire through a partnership between Council and River Road Creative Academy. The project will support Wollondilly's young people to tell their stories through the creative arts.

As part of the project, mentors from the River Road Creative Academy will receive Youth Mental Health First Aid training. The Academy will also be working alongside local psychologists from Wildflower Holistic Services to provide additional support to the young people taking part in the program.

Young people are invited to attend a series of creative workshops, which will include music, film, drama, visual arts, street art and photography where they will be supported to create their own artistic works.

# WOLLONDILLY CULTURAL PRECINCT

Work on the Performing Arts Centre in Picton has officially begun, thanks to funding from grants and developer contributions. This is an exciting next step in Stage One of the Wollondilly Cultural Precinct project.

Council is now in the process of demolishing the RFS building, Masonic Hall and old Children's Services Cottage so building of the Performing Arts Centre can begin. Demolition is now under way with construction scheduled to start in March.

The multi-format Performing Arts Centre will provide a stateof-the-art local venue for music, theatre, exhibitions and civic events, and will be a major injection into the cultural life of Picton and the wider Wollondilly area.

Other parts of the project are also taking shape, with construction teams now putting the finishing touches on the new Children's Services Building and the Library renovations, which are expected to be ready for use in April.

The new Children's Services Building will facilitate the relocation of Council's existing 30 place before and after school care and

school holiday care services and will accommodate a 30-place preschool in a modern and fit for purpose building.

Renovations to the Library building will provide a larger, more functional space for community members to browse collections, work remotely, collaborate and read. The newly created community lounge on the first floor will include large tables for group work, comfortable chairs and access to power for charging personal devices. There will also be two bookable study rooms and assistive technology available in support of people living with disability.

The completion of the Performing Arts Centre will wrap up Stage One of the Wollondilly Cultural Precinct. When completed, the Wollondilly Cultural Precinct will provide the residents of Wollondilly and visitors a fantastic place to enjoy cultural experiences, learn, play, live and work and will highlight Picton's heritage and character.

This project is funded by grants including the Western Parkland City Liveability Program, developer contributions and building renewal funds.
