

Wollondilly Shire Council has received its audited 2022-23 Annual Financial Statements, which have shown the organisation to be in a sound financial position with strong improvement over the year.

Council is recovering from the financial impacts of major fire, flood and storm events in recent years, and is gearing up to improve services for its current community and manage the rapidly growing population. A Financial Management Improvement Plan was put in place by the Council leadership four years ago, with the plan delivering clear results for Council and the community. While three years ago the year's financial statements were not being signed off until the following May, this year they have been signed off on time, thanks to some significant internal reforms.

The big winner has been Council's road network, with the huge investment in the Shire's roads delivering results. This is demonstrated by Council exceeding the Building and Infrastructure Renewal Ratio for the sixth successive year.

In great news for residents, an outstanding result for the Capital Works program was achieved, with Council delivering a record \$51.3M in capital works for 2022/23, 112% of the originally adopted budget of \$45.8M.

Wollondilly is again leading the way, with many Councils not finalising their audited financial statements on time. This is a great milestone for any effective organisation to achieve – clear evidence our plan to make Council an even higher performing organisation is paying dividends.

Maintaining a sound financial position will of course require ongoing monitoring and evaluation to make sure we can stay flexible; however, we are well placed to keep moving forward positively and are well prepared to meet the challenges ahead.

BACKYARD SWIMMING POOL SAFETY

Swimming pools at home can be lots of fun for the whole family and a great way to teach young children how to swim and how to be safe around water.

But pools can also be dangerous for young children, so they need constant adult supervision.

A swimming pool barrier is important for keeping children safe. Make sure your swimming pool barrier is safe and compliant with fencing regulations – including for in ground, above ground, portable pools and spas.

Regardless of your pool type, if your swimming pool can hold more than 300mm (30cm) of water you will need to have a physical barrier that restricts access to the swimming pool.





POTHOLE REQUESTS HIT A RECORD LOW

In great news for Wollondilly residents, Council's outstanding pothole requests (CRMs) reached a record low during September and October 2023. Since the damaging rain events of 2021/2022, Council's road maintenance crews have been working hard to lessen the huge backlog of pothole requests.

The recent sunny weather has allowed the crews to work uninterrupted on road repairs, and the rain damage to the roads has gradually decreased. Every day we are seeing our road crews out and about getting it done.

We are also continuing to focus on our massive heavy patching work program, funded through the State Government's Regional and Local Roads Repair Program, while addressing legacy roads issues through a record investment in our Capital Works Program.

RECYCLING COLLECTION DURING THE FESTIVE SEASON!

In response to community feedback, we will once again be collecting recycling on a weekly basis during the 2023/24 festive season.

Yellow lid recycling bins will be collected on a weekly basis from Monday 11 December until Friday 5 January inclusive. During this period, you can put out your yellow lid recycling bin with your red lid garbage bin each week on your normal bin day. Your green lid garden organics bin collection will continue as normal on a fortnightly service during this period.

From Monday 8 January 2024 the yellow lid recycling bin collection returns to normal fortnightly collection.

Connect & Interact WOLLONDILLY PROJECT

Digital kiosks will soon be operational in public spaces in the communities of Oakdale, Warragamba and Bargo.

Wollondilly residents have identified digital connectivity challenges that have significant implications during natural disasters. The digital kiosks provide access to the Wollondilly Disaster Dashboard, which provides the latest emergency information during a disaster and also provides information to help prepare for a disaster.

These new kiosks will provide access to:

- Public WiFi and USB charging facilities
- Wollondilly Shire Council website
- Wollondilly Disaster Dashboard (providing information related to fires, flooding, roads, weather, and more)
- Wollondilly tourism information

The project is funded by the NSW Bushfire Resilience and Recovery Fund.



THE WOLLONDILLY



The Wollondilly Performing Arts Centre is taking shape, with construction now progressing onto level two. During October excavation was completed for the recessed seating/musicians pit, followed by the concrete pour. In the back of house area, structural steel was installed and internal walls set out in preparation for fit out for the stage.

KNOWING THE FIRE DANGER RATING MAY SAVE YOUR LIFE

The Fire Danger Ratings give you an indication of the consequences of a fire, if a fire was to start. They do not indicate the chance of a fire occurring, although this is a common misconception.

The higher the rating is, the more dangerous the conditions will be.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The Fire Danger Ratings have four levels, which are:

MODERATE

PLAN AND PREPARE

At **MODERATE**, most fires can be controlled. Plan and prepare and be ready to act if there is a fire.

HIGH

TAKE ACTION NOW

TOTAL FIRE BAN

NSW RURAL FIRE SERVICE

YOUR FIRE RISK TODAY IS

BE READY TO ACT

At **HIGH**, be ready to act. Fires can be dangerous, so be alert for fires in your area.

EXTREME

TAKE ACTION NOW

TO PROTECT LIFE AND PROPERTY

At **EXTREME**, fires will spread quickly and become extremely dangerous. If a fire starts, take immediate action. If you and your property are not prepared to the highest level, go to a safer location well before the fire impacts.

CATASTROPHIC

FOR YOUR SURVIVAL

LEAVE BUSH FIRE RISK AREAS

Under **CATASTROPHIC** conditions, if a fire starts and takes hold, lives are likely to be lost. For your survival, leave bush fire risk areas. Stay safe by going to a safer location early in the morning or the night before.

NO RATING - On days when there's minimal risk, the white bar meaning 'No Rating' will be used. Report any fires to 000.
