FORMAL COMMUNITY FORUM MATTERS

1. Community Safety

Inspector David Williamson of Camden Police Area Command (PAC) addressed the meeting to present the crime data for the portion of Wollondilly in Camden.

The Inspector advised the greatest area of concern was domestic violence. He attributed the increase potentially to the Covid lockdown with a significant increase over the past three months from around 8 last period up to 40 plus. The areas trending highest were Tahmoor, Oakdale, Picton and Bargo.

Major traffic incidents were also highlighted with 18 occurring this period. This is alarming with a number of fatalities on the Hume Motorway. The inspector noted that he suspects with more people getting out and about as restrictions ease attributed to these figures. They will be increasing their proactivity in the near future targeting major roads.

Stolen Motor Vehicle incidents have dramatically risen from 1 in the last period to 10. The inspector advised that this could be linked to a small group of individuals that have either returned to the area or come into the area from hotspots. Of the 10 incidents 8 to 9 charges and prosecutions have been laid.

Drug detections and supply charges remain steady however an increase is expected as the public health order restrictions lift and businesses open back up such as pubs and clubs.

Finally the inspector noted that they utilise a number of resources, roster police 24/7 across Wollondilly including general duties, detectives and proactive teams. Overall Camden's crime rates are trending under our expected numbers, with the crime areas seeing a noticeable jump explainable.

Cr Banasik asked questions which were answered/acknowledged on the night. The inspector noting his concerns.

The Chair thanked the Inspector for his time. He also acknowledged the Police for their great work noting the successful outcome in finding Cleo in Western Australia.

The Chair welcomed Acting Sergeant, Craig Busby of Nepean command to the Forum. The A/Sergeant advised that Wollondilly occupied a very small portion of Nepean command. Highlighted was that Domestic Violence statistics had also risen with 5 noted in Silverdale however they were very minor in nature. Other than that they have a number of trending occurrences yet none that represent a concern in Silverdale, Warragamba or Wallacia. They have had greater involvement in relation to firearm legislation, conducting inspections to ensure compliance once again with no issues in Wollondilly. From his perspective everything is trending quite well. The data which was unavailable on the night is subsequently listed below.
