Note:

The Local Traffic Committee is a Technical Committee of Roads and Maritime Services (RMS). The Committee operates under the authority conferred to Council by the RMS under the Transport Administration Act 1988.

Council has been delegated certain powers, from the RMS, with regard to traffic matters upon its local roads. A condition of this delegation is that Council must take into account the Traffic Committee recommendations.

There are four permanent members of the Traffic Committee, each of whom has a single vote only. The members are representatives of the NSW Police Force, the Roads and Maritime Services, the Local State Member of Parliament (for the location of the issue to be voted upon) and a representative of Council.

If the RMS or NSW Police Force disagrees with any Traffic Committee recommendation, or Council's resolution on any Traffic Committee recommendation, that member may lodge an appeal with the Regional Traffic Committee for determination.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

A design proposal to incorporate a raised threshold onto existing pedestrian crossing on Oaks Street outside Thirlmere Public School and a Stop sign control on Carlton St at Oaks Street Thirlmere to improve pedestrian safety is presented for consideration.

REPORT

Council has a design proposal to incorporate a raised threshold onto existing pedestrian crossing on Oaks Street outside Thirlmere Public School and a Stop sign control on Carlton Street at Oaks Street.

This proposal will enhance the safety of pedestrians especially school children using the pedestrian crossing. The raised threshold will improve the visibility of pedestrians and slowing traffic down.

Please note the following comments for the SAS crossing at Thirlmere:-

- 1. Fluoro yellow should be used for the warning signs W6-3 and W8-22 to increase visibility.
- 2. No Stopping signs should be installed on Carlton Rd for the mandatory 10m.
- 3. Signs relevant to the crossing should be provided on both approaches.



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

 To consider the endorsement of the construction of a roundabout at the intersection of Regreme Road and Argyle Street.

REPORT

The Committee has previously considered and endorsed the preliminary design of the proposed roundabout control at the intersection of Regreme Rd and Argyle St.

As part of the DA consent for a residential development off Argyle St opposite Regreme Road Picton, a condition of the approval was for the construction of a roundabout at the intersection of Regreme Road and Argyle Street at the entrance to the site.

The final design is near completion and Council is seeking final endorsement from RMS.

All Committee agreed that a roundabout is necessary due to high level of growth in the area.



3. <u>Dam Fest 2015 at Warragamba on 18 October 2015 - Request for Road</u> Closure

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Organiser of the "Dam Fest 2015" at Warragamba is seeking Council approval for section of Farnsworth Ave, west of the junction with Warradale Rd, to be closed on Sunday, 18/10/2015 from 6.00am to 6.30pm to facilitate the holding of the event.

REPORT

The Dam Fest Organising Committee is again hosting the "Dam Fest 2015" event on Sunday, 18 October 2015 from 10.00am to 4pm.

The road closure required will be the same as last years which is a section of Farnsworth Ave (from west of junction with Warradale Rd). This is where the car and bike show entrants take their vehicles through to the old kiosk parking area. All entrants will be in no later than 10.30am and the road will stay closed for the duration of the event.

According to the Organiser and as in previous year's events, RFS will be manning this road closure and directing traffic to the appropriate areas. This road closure will cause minimal disruption to local traffic.

The Organiser is keen to involve both communities of Warragamba and Silverdale, and continue this annual event.

It is recommended the proposed closures be approved subject to conditions.

CONSULTATION

According to the Organisers, this event has had the popular support of the local community in previous years.

There have been no objections or concerns recorded from the general public about this event. The Organisers are in the process of applying to the Police to have a coordinated effort and provide the appropriate level of traffic management for the event.

- 1. That Council approve the road closure of a section of Farnsworth Ave, West of junction with Warradale Rd at Warragamba between the hours of 6:00am to 6:30pm on Sunday, 18 October 2015 subject to the listed conditions.
- 2. That the event be approved subject to the following conditions:
 - a) Proof of Police and RMS concurrence of the closure and details of detours must be provided to Council before the event.
 - A copy of the TCP by authorised personnel must be provided to Council before the event.
 - c) Notice of the event is to be published in a local newspaper/s at least seven (7) days prior to the event advising of the road closure, the detours and the time these changes apply.
 - d) Organisers shall notify the following people/organisations of the event and impacts for traffic management:
 - e) All residents along the affected route and side roads within the route.
 - f) Bus Operator of the area.
 - g) Emergency services including RFS (Rural Fire Service), Ambulance, Police and Fire and Rescue NSW.
 - h) Access shall be maintained for all residents and emergency service vehicles.
 - All traffic controls must be implemented, maintained and removed by authorised personnel only.
 - j) Proof of \$20 million Public Liability Insurance indemnifying Wollondilly Shire Council must be provided before the event.
 - k) Prior approval must be obtained from Council for the use of variable message boards where applicable.

All signs relating to the closures and detours must be in place prior to the event and be removed immediately after the event.

1. Australian Government Black Spot Programme 2015 - 2016

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Council has been successful in securing a total grant of \$634,000 under the 2015 – 2016 Australian Government Black Spot Programme Project Funding.

REPORT

Council is continually seeking external funding sources to address road network issues including crash risks. One main contributor is the Australian Government Black Spot Programme which provides 100% grant funding to eligible projects on the basis of high cost benefit ratio (BCR). Council in the past has successfully gained substantial funding grants from this Programme.

Council has identified 6 potential locations with a number of crashes for submission for the 2015-2016 project funding and successfully obtain grants offer of \$640,000 on 4 locations. The community has also expressed its concerns about the high number of crashes at these locations.

These projects are subject to further detailed design with Council Design Engineers and RMS concurrence prior to implementation.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

 Council to consider the implementation of 20kph speed restriction zone within Council Recreation Area and car park.

REPORT

Council has received a resident request to investigate and prevent speeding of vehicles within the Warragamba Recreation Reserve off Farnsworth Ave and Warradale Road, Warragamba.

One consideration is to install 20kph signs within the area as a deterrent to speeding drivers.

It is worth noting that the speed zone restriction only applies to gazetted public roads under the roads and transport regulations, however, for off road public areas, the Police could carry out infringement notices under the "public access " regulation.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Council to notify an upcoming event "Kangaroo" re-enactment of recruitment march and for motion of Local traffic Committee to negotiate the details of the route.

REPORT

The Manager of Major Government Events, Transport Management Centre (TMC) of NSW Government – Transport for NSW has written to Council to alert of an upcoming event "The Kangaroo March" to commemorate the centenary of ANZAC. It is a commemorative event to re-enact the original Kangaroo ANZAC Recruitment March undertaken between Wagga Wagga and Campbelltown in 1915. The event will be planned and hosted by forming local organising committees (LOC) and will be contacting Council in due course.

Currently, confirmation is being sought for the classification of the event by the Department of Premier and Cabinet (DPC).

Four generic Traffic Control Plans (TCP) and NSW Police approved route maps has been developed as the basis for the LOC to negotiate the details with individual local Police and Council along the route.

Upon further notification, Council will have a response to the Kangaroo LOC together with the Police to ensure public safety and minimal disruption to the community.

CONSULTATION

This issue has not been raised and discussed in a Community Forum. The organiser (TMC) is in the process of obtaining classification approval from the DPC and organising Kangaroo LOC.



I write in regard to the proposed "Kangaroo" Re-enactment of Recruitment March to be held Saturday 5th September to Friday 9th October 2015.

The Kangaroo March is a Centenary of ANZAC Commemorative event and endeavours to re-enact and commemorate the original Kangaroo ANZAC Recruitment March undertaken between Wagga Wagga and Campbelltown in 1915.

The NSW Government, through the Department of Premier and Cabinet (DPC), acknowledges the significance of the original nine WWI ANZAC Recruitment Marches held across the state in 1915-16, and has listed these marches within the 20 major Centenary of ANZAC projects being overseen by the NSW Government between 2014 -2018.


To help plan for the various Marches across the state, each March group has formed a local organising committee (LOC). Additional to this, to help facilitate and create a consistent approach for each March, Mr Steve Elliott, Manager Major Government Event at the NSW Transport Management Centre (TMC) and Inspector Paul Carrett from the NSW Police Major Events and Incidents Group (MEIG), have been nominated to lead each group through the event planning and approval process.

The Event Class for this Special Event is still waiting final confirmation by the Department of Premier and Cabinet (DPC), although it is likely all Re-enactment of Recruitment Marches will be listed as a Class C — Commemorative Event.


The NSW Police and TMC have set strict guidelines in regard to the event route that each March will take. For the large part the original 1915 route the March travelled via Highways and other major roads between Wagga Wagga and Campbelltown. This will not be approved in 2015 due to high vehicle speeds, heavy vehicles, road safety issues and the large traffic volumes that now use these routes. Most of the event in 2015 will now be undertaken on parallel local routes to allow the event to proceed.

Four generic Traffic Control Plans (TCP's) have also been prepared for this event which will be the basis to allow each March to be undertaken. The configuration of the March within each TCP takes into consideration the road environment, traffic volumes and road speeds, and is inline with other similar events that traverse long distances across NSW.












