

### **COVID-19 vaccinations**

# Information for adults aged 50 years and over in South Western Sydney

Adults aged 50 years and over are now eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine. The AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine is administered.

Almost 200 general practices in South Western Sydney are part of the national vaccination rollout. GP respiratory clinics and Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Services are also administering vaccines.

#### Arrange your COVID vaccination

- Call your GP: If your regular general practice is a COVID-19 vaccination clinic give them a call to arrange your vaccination.

#### Bring identification to your vaccination appointment

All standard forms of identification (drivers licence, passport) and government issued documents with your date of birth (e.g. Centrelink, Medicare, Department of Veterans Affairs) will be accepted. If you have a My Health Record, this can also be used as identification.

Individuals attending their usual GP may rely on their clinic's records as evidence.
