WE ARE HERE TO HELP

The Wollondilly community has faced countless challenges in recent times due to drought, bushfires, floods and the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic. Local businesses and individuals are doing it tough right now.

We're here to help and have a range of programs in place to support business and the community.

In response to the current outbreak and extended lockdown, Council has adopted the Business Support Package 2021. This will include a series of additional initiatives to make it easier for our small businesses and strengthen the local economy.

We will be prioritising local businesses when planning Council contracted service delivery, accelerating payment timeframes to help with cash flow, and waiving Council fees for small businesses including development application and assessment fees.

Other ways we are supporting local businesses include:

- Amending our local planning controls to make it easier to celebrate in Wollondilly, particularly for destination weddings, overnight stays, events and markets.
- Employing a new Executive Planner Business & Investment, responsible for enhancing greater business investment opportunities for the Shire. They will be directly supporting local business growth and job creation through the development application process.

 Continuing and enhancing the Tourism and Small Business Support team's range of programs and resources to support small business through the economic impact of Covid-19 and recovery.

Council has allocated \$50,000 to a special Covid-19 Community Grants Program so that community organisations can support residents and rate payers impacted by the current Covid-19 restrictions. We know personal income has been reduced due to job cutbacks and loss of hours, and we will be working with Wollondilly-based community organisations to make sure everyone is supported during this time.

Ratepayers and businesses who are experiencing financial difficulty can also apply for assistance through Council's hardship policy.
