Acting Inspector Erryn Williams of Camden Police Area Command was in attendance via audio video link. Data from 11 August to 8 November 2020 Assaults 30 (21DV and 9 non-DV). Aged sector 5 DV 2 non-DV-Slightly down. Break and Enters 10 total 7 Picton and 3 The Oaks – rural properties particularly targeting motor vehicle thefts. Malicious damage- Picton 44 and The Oaks 2. Up from last period. Steal from Motor Vehicles- Picton 20 The Oaks 3. Slightly up. Stolen Vehicles- Picton 10 and The Oaks 4. Up from last guarter. Business Inspections Picton 93 and The Oaks 9 School Inspections 35 Picton and The Oaks 2 Person Searches 162 and The Oaks 4. Up from last period. Vehicle Searches -Picton 63 and The Oaks 1. Drug detections steady -22 Picton and The Oaks 3. Traffic Infringements 676 (mostly tickets being issued). Slightly down. Crime and Messages- lot of staff redeployed to border and guarantine tasks but set to return to normal. Again, cars are left unlock in a lot of the break and enter/ stolen vehicles so please lock your cars even if you are not far away from it. Also please report as soon as aware of an incident – the timing is crucial in investigations. Memories fade and CCTV footage of neighbouring properties may not be saved for long periods. Acting Inspector Paul Kremer of Nepean Police Area Command was in attendance via audio video link. Appin has had an increase in reports of trail bikes and loitering in parkland.
