

Mr Boris Ballango, a teacher from Tahmoor Public School, gave a presentation on the Thirlmere Lakes Project. A summary is provided below:


- I am a Special Needs Teacher who works with a class of 9 students at Tahmoor Public School in the Support Unit for the last 7 years. My students in my class have Autism, ADHD, and learning difficulties.
- They have a passion and a goal of wanting to place Thirlmere Lakes back on the map for past, present and future Wollondilly residents.
- The entire school were asked to choose a specific study and/or research a chosen topic or a focus area of interest. It was easier that my students were guided and supported, so we are doing this as a class enquiry. The students in the Support Unit and myself decided that we wanted to work on something realistic and that everyone could gain from.
- The students also wanted to choose something they could give back to our community and the Wollondilly Shire as a whole, and turn it into a vital discussion point and ongoing project from a student's perspective and point of view.
- The project has included my students complete data collection ranging from community walks, survey drops, newsletter surveys, interviews from past and present community members.







2. Menangle Fox Campaign - Greater Sydney Local Lands Services

Roger Giles from Barragal Landcare together with Dr Alison Towerton from the Greater Sydney Local Land Services gave a presentation on the Menangle Fox Campaign. Summary provided below:

Menangle Fox Campaign

Objective

To protect livestock and domestic animals across the landscape and the native flora and fauna within the remnant Cumberland Plains Woodlands by reducing fox activity within the campaign area.




Foxes are one of Australia's most serious pest animals. Since their introduction to Australia in the 1870s, the fox has contributed to the decline and extinction of a number of native animals and livestock predation and now cost more than an estimated \$227 million annually. A Pest Control Order for foxes has recently been gazetted in NSW, making them a declared pest to be controlled. Foxes may also spread weeds and disease, in winter fox scats can be over 90% African olive seed. Foxes are also great climbers, seen here high up in a tree.








The greatest impact will be when landholders and residents act together twice a year, and their efforts are mapped so that gaps across the landscape can be targeted during following control operations. Foxes won't be eradicated, this is a long-term campaign to reduce and maintain the reduction in the fox population and their impacts.

Campaign workshops are held twice a year before the spring and autumn control operations. Attendees are provided with the latest information on control techniques, disease research and camera trap monitoring results as well as other topics of interest such as fox diet and movements across Sydney.
