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### **OPENING BY THE CHAIRPERSON**

The Chairperson, Cr Briggs opened the Community Forum at 6.30pm. The Chairperson welcomed all those in attendance at the Community Forum. The Chairperson introduced the Mayor, Cr Hannan; Councillors and Directors to the Community Forum participants. Cr Smith was congratulated on his recent election to East Ward following the By-Election.

The Chairperson stated that the electronic recording of the Community Forum and the use of electronic media during the proceedings is not permitted including devices such as laptops, mobile phones, tape recorders and video cameras. The Chairperson requested that participants switch off their mobile phones.

### 1. **Community Safety**

Constable Amy Buschmann from St. Marys Local Area Command (LAC) opened the presentation and provided the following statistics.

In October there were 125 assaults; 5 robberies; and 2 offenders being monitored for Break and Enters. Retail theft was mainly contributable to youths stealing from shops. This has been alleviated by incorporating this into operation "light fingers" where a number of charges have been laid with 20 to 30 person searches conducted.

Constable Buschmann advised that malicious damage incidents have decreased with Warragamba having significantly lower occurrences than other areas in the St. Marys LAC. Domestic Violence reports have also decreased. They have 10 offenders on their list currently who they are doing compliance checks on.

Participants were informed that a merge between St Mary's and Penrith LAC was occurring and by 17 December 2017 they will be called Nepean Police Area Command.

The constable advised that there is currently one officer stationed in Warragamba who starts their shift at St. Mary's and then relocates. The station at Warragamba is being renovated and upgraded. It was noted that the house that the police officer used to live in is being demolished. The constable was unsure as to the future plans for Warragamba Police Station.

Chief Inspector Shane Howard from Campbelltown LAC continued the presentation firstly by giving an apology for Inspector Tara Norton.

The Chief Inspector advised that Campbelltown LAC are merging with Macquarie Fields which will result in around 300 members in this force.

The crime figures for the Appin area over the last three months were down with a number of operations happening in the area. Statistics presented were as follows:

- 5 x Assaults
- 12 x Business Inspections
- 17 x Domestic Violence incidents
- 11 x Move On
- 25 x Personal Searches
- 21 x Vehicle Searches
- 9 x Licencing Legislation matters
- 3 x Stealing
- 1 x Stolen Motor Vehicle
- 6 x Malicious Damage (Included Council gates to fire trails)



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### Formal Community Forum Matters

In total there were 177 incidents over the reporting period. Over half of which, are as a result of the police being proactive in the area.

The Chief Inspector highlighted the fact that no break and enters occurred and that Alcohol Free Zones are now being enforced in the area. The police perspective being that it was a very positive result for the past three months.

Participants were advised that with the increased LAC they still intend to continue in the area.

Chief Inspector Pearsall from Camden LAC wound up the presentation with the statistics for The Oaks and Picton.

The Inspector highlighted the following statistics for the previous four months, July to October 2017.

- 12 x Assaults
- 13 x Break and Enters
- 21 x Domestic Violence matters
- 2 x AVO (Apprehended Violence Order) Breaches
- 5 x Drug Detections
- 6 x Fraud
- 13 x Person Searches
- 133 x Traffic Incidents

It was stated that visibility in the area is up with Officer Simon Jones very active in The Oaks. There is a lot of proactive activities happening with an increase in personal inspections.

The inspector noted that assaults are slightly up since September as is fraud matters which are up state wide.

Statistics were provided for Picton as follows:

61 x Assaults

5 x AVO's

17 x Break and Enter

218 x Business Inspections

79 x Domestic Violence Incidents

33 x Drug Detections

32 x Fraud

41 x Major Traffic Crashes

57 x Malicious Damage

171x Personal Searches

111 x School Inspections

5 x Stolen Vehicle/Vessel

2176 x Traffic Offences

The participants were advised that assaults were up a little, coming into warmer months they are generally alcohol related. Drug offences are also up which is positive as it indicates police are being proactive.

The Chairperson, on behalf of the Wollondilly community, thanked the police for coming out this evening and for all the work they do in the area.

A number of questions were asked and answered by the police from each LAC on the night.

All questions must be submitted in writing by 12 noon on the day of the Forum. There will be a maximum of 2 speakers for and against a matter with each speaker limited to 5 minutes.

The Chairperson reinforced that Community Forums are to provide information and to allow comment and are not a debate night. The Chairperson asked that speakers address them and Councillors on all occasions, to stay on the subject matter and avoid making personal remarks about individuals.

The Executive Director, Ally Dench read out the Executive Summary from the Council report for each agenda item discussed throughout the night.
