Inspector Paul Kremer provided the following statistics of the Appin area for the period form 1 November 2021 until 31 January 2022:

Assaults: 4 (increase of 2 from previous quarter)

 - Appin Skate Park counter allegations by two school aged children of assault upon each other

2. <u>Picton Town Centre Transport Masterplan 2026 – Status update and</u> proposed Prince Street Signalisation

The Chair introduced Council's Manager Assets, Transport and Engineering, Mike Nelson to provide an update on the Picton Town Centre Transport Masterplan 2026.

Mr Nelson provided an update on the traffic study which commenced in 2017 and is now known as the Picton Town Centre Transport Master Plan 2026. The study area covered the intersections of Menangle Street and Argyle Street, Colden Street and Margaret Street between Menangle Street and Argyle Street, Prince Street and its intersections with Menangle Street and Argyle Street, the Argyle Street/Barkers Lodge Road intersection (with consideration given to its impact on the adjacent Coull Street/Picton Avenue intersection) and Lumsdaine Street around Picton Primary School.

Key findings from the study have shown:

- All main intersections around the Picton town centre loop will suffer congestion issues in the future
- Issues on Prince Street lead to broader network issues with, in effect, intermittent closure of Prince Street caused by queuing across the bridge
- Menangle St is a main road (State) owned, however the issues are on Prince Street (local road)
- Upgrades to the network including the signalisation of Prince Street has previously been identified in 2004 and the project adopted under Council's Development Contributions Plan 2011

The Picton Town Centre Masterplan was adopted in 2019 and some of the works as a result of this have already been achieved. This includes the reallocation of the pedestrian crossing on Argyle Street, implementation of "no right turn" at the intersection from Menangle Street to Argyle Street with the way around via Colden Street and Margaret Street and some upgrades to the intersection of Argyle Street and Barkers Lodge road to improve sight and visibility.

Mr Nelson explained that modelling of future traffic predictions is done under region wide modelling in conjunction with Camden Council and Campbelltown City Council which includes LEP zonings, traffic count data, expected development & growth, Census population data, existing and proposed road layouts. Further detailed levels of modelling is conducted to ensure the most accurate predictions can be achieved.

The possible options for improvement of the Prince Street and Menangle Street intersections are the installation of a roundabout, reducing Prince Street to one way or signalisation. Reducing Prince Street to one way would not be practical. In comparing a roundabout to signalisation, a roundabout offers similar vehicle performance, poorer pedestrian connectivity, larger footprint resulting in significant impact to private property, significantly more works involved resulting in a higher cost, no better for on street parking and due to the close proximity of the Station Street intersection, the design of a roundabout is difficult.

In December 2019 Council resolved to pursue the detailed design of signalisation of the Prince Street and Menangle Street intersection. An image was shown of an artist's impression of how the proposed design would look.

Also included in the Masterplan are:

- Improvements to the Prince Street and Argyle Street intersection to a dedicated left and right turn lane into Prince Street
- Improvements to pedestrian safety around Picton Primary School and potential upgrades to the intersection of Lumsdaine Street and Argyle Street. A concept design has been developed and principle approval from Transport for NSW has been received to signalise this intersection which would increase pedestrian access and safety.
