FORMAL COMMUNITY FORUM MATTERS

1. <u>Community Safety Presentation</u>

The Chair introduced Chief Inspector George Psaroudis of Campbelltown Police Area Command (PAC) to address the meeting. The Chief Inspector presented the crime data for the portion of Wollondilly in Campbelltown as detailed below:

Assault: 1 x Domestic Violence (DV) assault. POI arrested and charged.

Break and Enters: 0

Fraud: 8

- 6 x Fail to Pay Metro Petroleum
- 1 x Scam selling Under Investigation
- 1 x Scam obtain fund—via social media means. Subject to current investigation.

Malicious Damage: 3

- 1 x Damaged letter box no further investigation
- 1 x Unregistered trail bikes have destroyed the glass area and grassed area within Appin Park. Possible persons identified however insufficient evidence to proceed
- 1 x Malicious damage DV related.

Stealing: 3

- 1 x Stealing from retail store: Mobil Service Station CCTV depicts 2 x Persons of interest stealing some items. Matter under investigation.
- 1 x Appin Hotel purse stolen from handbag fraudulent transactions have been made. Matter currently under investigation. Strong likelihood of an outcome.
- 1 x Stealing from motor vehicle July Plate theft.

Trends

The Metro Petroleum have had a steady occurrence of Fail to Pay reported incidents in this period. Both diesel and unleaded fuel appear to be the main fuel options in addition to one incident of retail theft currently under investigation.

The Chair thanked the Chief Inspector for his time.

The Chair noted that Chief Inspector Kai Penninkilampi of Nepean Police Area Command (PAC) was unable to address the meeting to present the crime data for the portion of Wollondilly in Nepean. A copy of the below statistics was circulated to the Councillors.

1 urgent job (response 23m) – concern for welfare (x1).

May 2022

Nepean PAC total incidents - 6732

Silverdale - 28 (0.4%)

• 3 urgent jobs (fastest response 19m, slowest response 24m, average response 21m) – check bona fides (x3), domestic (x2), self-harm (x2)

Warragamba – 18 (0.2%)

• 2 urgent jobs (fastest response 30m, slowest response 30m, average response 30m) – concern for welfare (x1), self-harm (x1).

June 2022

Nepean PACC total incidents - 7376

Silverdale – 39 (0.5%)

 10 urgent jobs (fastest 15m, slowest 38m, average 28m) – neighbour dispute (x7), check bona-fides (x2), concern for welfare (x1)

Warragamba – 10 (0.1%)

 3 urgent jobs (fastest response 21m, slowest response 28m, average response 25m) – concern for welfare (x3), domestic (x1).

Highlights:

- Silverdale and Warragamba account for less than 1% of police calls for service to Nepean PAC
- Nepean PAC maintain an operationally-ready police station at Warragamba which is stood-up as required
- Warragamba Police Station passed a WH&S audit during the quarter
- Nepean PAC and Nepean Highway Patrol conduct overt and covert patrols
- No statistically significant change to profile or evidence of emerging trends
- Public awareness -- "Hi Mum" text scam report online to ReportCyber at https://www.cyber.gov.au/acsc/report or local police station
- The most common call for service at Warragamba was "concern for welfare"
- The most common call for service at Silverdale was "domestic violence".

The Chair introduced Inspector Dave Williamson from Camden PAC to address the meeting. Inspector Williamson presented the crime data for the portion of Wollondilly in Camden as highlighted below:

- Crime statistics major offences are traffic related
 - The Oaks 73
 - Werombi 20
- Picton Road and Werombi Road is a focus area for traffic offences
- Concerted effort by Macarthur and Wollongong Highway Patrol units working in collaboration to address some of the issues on Picton Road at peak times
- The Oaks remains a significant focus
- Across Wollondilly patch no break and enters, which has been great
- No stealing of motor vehicles
- 27 business inspections were carried out.

Questions asked were answered on the night.
