#### Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$7 billion over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver more than 200 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

#### Project overview

- A major project is underway to redevelop Picton High School.
- The redevelopment will provide new flexible learning spaces, a new library and administration area, performance arts spaces, special education facilities and covered outdoor learning areas and recreation areas.
- The new school will have capacity for 1500 students.

#### Progress summary

Main works are underway with the structure complete, while roofing, internal partitions, services fit out and façade have started.

We anticipate the new facilities will be ready to handover for the school to use from mid-2021.

Over the summer school holidays, works to improve pedestrian safety along Argyle Street and Wonga Road will include:

- Modifications inside the bus bay;
- Additional footpath on Argyle Street West to Henry Street;
- Additional footpath on Wonga Road North; and
- Associated line marking to access the school.

#### Term One

Upon return to school in Term One 2021 the following upgrades will have been completed:

- Buildings A, E, F and G painted, and flooring and ceilings finished.
- All external scaffolding removed.
- Landscaping of much of the open space areas will have been undertaken during the break, with work continuing during Term 1.

## Summer Holidays Works Frequently asked questions

### What works will be completed over the holidays?

Construction activities will continue during the summer holidays with works undertaken to improve the safety of pedestrians when accessing the school entrance via Argyle Street and access via Wonga Road. Work on the construction site will include painting and landscaping.

### Will construction take place over Christmas and New Year?

No work will be undertaken on public holidays or Sunday.

### What are the construction working hours?

Construction hours of the summer school holidays will be as per the standard hours of:

Monday to Friday: 7:00am to 6:00pm

Saturday: 8:00am to 1:00pm

### What safety measures will be in place?

Health and safety is our highest priority. All work on site will be conducted in accordance with NSW Government noise, safety and building regulations.

Perimeter hoardings have been installed to prevent non-construction workers accessing the site.

We will aim to limit construction impacts to local residents as much as possible.

### How will traffic be managed?

Traffic control and security measures will be in place where required for the safety of the community.
