## 1.1 WARRAGAMBA ANZAC DAY MARCH AND COMMEMORATION ON SATURDAY 25 APRIL 2020

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

It is recommended that Council approves the closure of Fourteenth Street, Warragamba from Twentieth Street to Weir Road and Civic Centre Circle between 9.30am to 12.00pm on Saturday 25 April 2020 for the staging of "The Warragamba ANZAC Day March 2020" subject to the requirements for the issue of a permit for "Road Event – Road Closure".

#### **REPORT**

The Warragamba ANZAC Day Committee has sought Council permission to march from Warragamba Neighbourhood Centre to the Warragamba Town Hall along Fourteenth Street, Warragamba to commemorate ANZAC Day 2020.

The proposal is to close a section of Fourteenth Street from Twentieth Street to Weir Road for the March.

The March participants consist of The Police, Blacktown Pipe Band Service personnel, ex-service personnel, relatives of ex-service personnel, and cadets will be present with marchers moving off from the Neighbourhood Centre at 11:00am along Fourteenth Street towards the Town Hall.

The expected duration of the march and the ceremony is 1 hour and 30 minutes for the affected road length.

Traffic is proposed to be diverted during the closure via Twentieth Street, Nineteenth Street, Eighteenth Street and Thirteenth Street.

The traffic control will be undertaken by authorised Traffic Controllers.

As in previous years, the conduct of the march under these proposals will not have much disruption to the public. It has been well received and supported by the local community.

It is worth noting that Hostile Vehicle Mitigation procedures have been taken into account by utilising the RFS Cat 1 & Cat 9 heavy vehicles for road blockage along with the use of water filled barricades.

As a result of the additional HVM procedures, the organiser is seeking to commence with the closure of the Civic Circle Road (around the Cenotaph) to commence at 09:30am as this will allow additional time for the RFS crews to place & fill the water barriers. There will be minimal disruption to the residents and tourists with adequate detours in place.

#### Consultation

This issue has not been raised and discussed in a Community Forum. The organiser has indicated that this event has strong community support.

#### **Financial Implications**

This matter has no financial impact on Council's adopted budget or forward estimates.

#### Re: Anzac Day Road Closures

Warragamba & Districts Anzac Committee will be holding a mach from the Warragamba Silverdale Neighbourhood Centre to Memorial Park Cenotaph (opposite the Warragamba Town Hall) where we will hold our Service. The Parade will commence at 11am and the service will conclude approximately 12noon. We are hoping that a Police Officer in his vehicle will lead this prestigious parade, followed by the Blacktown Pipe Band, Service Personnel, relatives, cadets along with local organizations and schools. We estimate approximately 300 marching and approximately 5000 in attendance. Our services are growing every year.

Once the service is concluded, the marchers proceed to the Neighbourhood Centre and some will carry on to the Warragamba Workers Club.

To maintain the safety of the participants and supportive crowds, we would like to apply to have Fourteenth St closed to traffic from Twentieth and fourteenth streets to the Neighbourhood Centre for a period of approximately 1 ½ hours from 10.30am to 12noon. The closures will be carried out by the Silverdale Rural Fire Services who are ticketed and this closure should cause little disruption to residents and tourists with detours in place.

Notifications of road closures will be by notices at all prominent areas in the disctrict and notification in the Gazette and letterbox drops. The bus companies will also be notified with alternate routes.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- The purpose of this report is seeking approval to use Old Razorback Road, Cawdor to conduct Individual Time Trial (ITT) events.
- It is recommended that Council approve the use of Old Razorback Road, Cawdor from the junctions of Cawdor Rd to Mt Hercules Rd for an Individual Time Trial (ITT) event, "Razorback Mountain Hill Climb" and the necessary temporary road closures on 3 May 2020 commencing 8:00am and finishing by 11:00am subject to the requirements for the issue of a permit for "Road Event Road Closure".

#### **REPORT**

Council has received an application from the Camden Cycling Club seeking approvals for 2 events to use Old Razorback Road, Cawdor between the junctions of Cawdor Rd and Mt. Hercules Rd to conduct an Individual Time Trial (ITT) event, called "Razorback Mountain Hill Climb".

However, the application for Sunday 19 April 2020 cannot be considered as this is prior to the Council Ordinary meeting date of the 21 April 2020 where the Local Traffic Committee's recommendation would be considered for endorsement. The applicant has been advised and agreed to withdraw the application for the 19 April 2020.

The remaining event is scheduled for Sunday 3 May 2020 commencing at 8:00am and finishing by 11:00am.

The ITT is an event where competitors ride alone, competing only against the clock. There will be no disruption to normal traffic and riders will not be permitted to either 'bunch up' or cross the centre of the roadway. All riders shall follow the road rules.

The Club has submitted an application to Council together with relevant documentations in support of its application.

As a similar race has been conducted successfully in previous years without adverse impact onto local area, it is therefore recommended for approval subject to conditions for the issue of a permit for "Road Event – Road Closure".

#### Consultation

This issue has not been raised and discussed in the Community Forum.

The club is in the process of applying to the Police Area Command for approval of the event similar to that obtained for previous years.

This matter has no financial impact on Council's adopted budget or forward estimates.



## MACARTHUR COLLEGIANS CYCLE CLUB – BICYCLE RACE APPLICATION (Individual Time Trials – Razorback Mountain Hill Climb)

An application to conduct an individual time trial (ITT) has been received from Mr. Michael GLEESON on behalf of the Macarthur Collegians Cycle Club. The proposed individual time trial will take place on Old Razorback Road, Cawdor and involve competitors riding alone competing against the clock. Competitors will commence at one minute intervals riding solo up Old Razorback Road, to a finish point just prior to the intersection with Mt Hercules Road. The event course is wholly contained within the suburb of Cawdor and only low volume, Local Council secondary roads in a rural environment will be impacted.

It is proposed that the individual time trials will be conducted on Sunday 7th April 2019 and Sunday 14th April 2019, commencing at 8.00am and concluding at 11.00am.

The proposed race circuit will not be a sterile environment. Competitors will be required to share available roadway capacity with motor vehicles.

The New South Wales Police recognise that road events form an integral part of community life styles, however as with all races there is a degree of risk. (NSW Police – Guidelines for Bicycle Road Races)

In accordance with Section 115 of the Road Transport Act 2013, I recommend this application be APPROVED with the following conditions;

- Organisers, officials & participants must take all reasonable measures to reduce obstruction to
  pedestrians or vehicles during the course of the event.
- Permission of the relevant Local Government Authorities must be obtained and any conditions adhered to.
- Organisers, officials & participants must obey any given direction given by a member of the Police Force or Roads & Traffic Authority in the interests of safety to all persons.
- Organisers, officials & participants must obey any direction given by a member of the Police Force under Road Transport Legislation or the Australian Roads Rules.
- 5. The event organiser must maintain a register, in the form of a bound book with individually number pages, containing the times (start & finish) and date of each race, the names of registered participants and event officials. Particulars of each event are to be entered into the register on a daily basis. This register must be produced to a member of the Police Force upon demand.

- The event organiser must only employ RMS accredited of certified marshals to manage the interaction between event participants and vehicles at critical intersections.
- Sufficient and correct signage (AS: 1742.3) must be utilised and deployed prior to and along the route to advise other road users of the potential existence of cyclists.
- Competitors are not permitted to exceed the posted speed limit or cross the virtual centre line of a
  roadway except when overtaking and only when legal to do so. Competitors are not permitted to
  ride more than two abreast except when legally overtaking and must be wholly contained within
  the nearside lane if on a multi lane roadway.
- All or any race will be stopped if atmospheric and road conditions deteriorate. All racing will be concluded prior to darkness.
- 10. The event organiser must have informed the New South Wales Fire Brigade and New South Wales Ambulance Service in writing of its intention to stage the event and details of any potential delays that may occur during the course of each day's racing.
- The event organiser must have the New South Wales Police Force indemnified in any and all Public Liability Insurance policies associated with this proposal.

#### 2.1 TRAFFIC DIVERSION ON BURRAGORANG ROAD, BELIMBLA PARK

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- The purpose of this report is to inform the Local Traffic Committee of the implementation of a traffic diversion for Burragorang Rd due to a section of the road being damaged at Back Creek, and the closure of the road to all traffic.
- It is recommended that information be noted.

#### **REPORT**

The recent severe storm event of the 9 February 2020 has led to a section of Burragorang Rd being washed out at Back Creek, rendering the road impassable. Council has implemented traffic diversions around this area to address the road closure until it is reconstructed.

Council has identified Russell Lane and Binalong Road, both with 8T sign posted load limit to be used as detour route for light vehicles only. All heavy vehicles will be detoured via Montpelier Drive.

Delineation and road improvement works on Russell Lane and Binalong Road have been carried out. These works include road shoulder repair; new centreline markings in accordance to current RMS Guidelines; new RRPM; additional warning signs and reduction of speed zone of 70kph to 60kph as part of a traffic management plan for the duration of the road closure.

Montpelier Drive has a 15T sign posted load limit restriction. The existing load limit status on this road has been deactivated and all load limit signs along this road have been covered up to facilitate this detour for heavy vehicles, only for the duration of the road closure.
